

IN MEMORY OF James Edward Holifield

July 18, 1938 ~ December 7, 2018 (age 80)



Brother James Edward Holifield, known to all of us as Ed, is dearly missed by all of his Odd Fellow brothers and sisters. Ed was born on July 18, 1938 and went home to Heaven to be with his wife on December 7, 2018. Ed was a true Odd Fellow, always helping others. The Independent Order of Odd Fellows is an

International fraternal organization that began in 18th Century England, where it was deemed 'odd' to find people organized for the purpose of giving aid to those in need, without recognition, and pursuing projects for the benefits of all mankind. Many years ago Ed became a member of an Odd Fellows Lodge in Mobile, Alabama. Later he followed his employer, Randall Fletcher and friends, transferring to Odd Fellows Grand Bay Lodge #73 where he remained a faithful member. The Odd Fellows symbol, three links of a chain, represents Friendship, Love, and Truth. demonstrated all three very well. On just about any day of the week you could find Ed at the Lodge on our Tractor cutting grass, moving limbs, or any number of things that needed to be done. Our Lodge puts on the Grand Bay Watermelon Festival to raise funds to operate and support our charities. During the Watermelon Festival Ed would proudly wear his Odd Fellows shirt and work to make the Festival a success. He, with some help from Monnie Tripp, rebuilt the deteriorating walking bridge at the base of the hill so people could easily get to the Grand Bay Watermelon Festival from the parking area. The two of them also built the handicapped walkway up to the Lodge building. Ed worked on the bleachers, cutting down trees, and much, much more. All of his life Ed was a professional carpenter, and Monnie didn't understand what this meant until he started working with him. Monnie always thought the jobs they were working on went too slow. Ed was always leveling, straightening, measuring, and aligning posts or boards that they were working on, but the end product always turned out right because he applied his professionalism to every job he did. The Lodge grounds, and the Grand Bay Watermelon Festival, wouldn't have turned out as nice as they did without Ed's tireless work; and he never asked for anything in return. The members of Grand Bay Lodge #73, and Martha Rebekah Lodge #29, loved him and appreciated him very much. Ed is truly missed.

IN MEMORY OF Randall H. Fletcher

November 15, 1934 ~ December 13, 2018 (age 84)



Brother Randall H. Fletcher is dearly missed by all of his fellow brothers and sisters of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows, Grand Bay Lodge #73, Martha Rebekah Lodge #29, and the Grand Lodge of Alabama. Randall was 84 years old and spent over 37 years with the Odd Fellows. He entered Odd

Fellowship in 1981 at the Otis Trehern Lodge #81 in Irvington, AL and served a term as Noble Grand. In 1984 Randall transferred to Grand Bay Lodge #73. He worked through the chairs (positions) in the Lodge and later became Grand Master of the Grand Lodge of Alabama.

The Odd Fellows symbol, three links of a chain, represents Friendship, Love, and Truth. Randall demonstrated all three plus generosity his entire life. Following principles in the Bible and the Odd Fellows Creed, Randall was always taking in strays, whether it be dogs or people, he was always there to help. He was a farmer and a construction business owner. As a farmer, Randall often gave produce from his field not only to his friends, but also to the needy.

In March of 1984 Randall put a house on some property that he owned, at his own expense, for a Lodge Hall for our Grand Bay Lodge. This remained the home of the Lodge until April of 2000. The Lodge then moved to Festival Park, where they took over the responsibility of putting on the annual Grand Bay Watermelon Festival for many years. The Watermelon Festival raises funds to operate the Park and better support our charities. Randall worked the Watermelon Festival, proudly wearing his Odd Fellows shirt, and helped to make the Festival a success. He also provided the watermelons at no cost to the Lodge, and oversaw the watermelon cutting.

In 1987 Randall spearheaded the purchase of 100 acres of property for the Grand Lodge of Alabama as a Park in Clanton, AL. After purchase of the property Randall and other members of the Grand Bay Lodge donated time, equipment, and materials to turn the Park into a camping, fishing, and Lodge meeting area. Randall was Clanton Park Director for 12 years.

The members of Grand Bay Lodge #73, and Martha Rebekah Lodge #29, loved him and appreciated him very much. Randall is truly missed.


The Mobile Bay Mustang Club meets at 7 pm the third Tuesday of each month (except December) at Morrison's

How to Grow a Watermelon

You can plant your watermelon seeds right from your next watermelon slice!

Supplies you will need:

- Watermelon Seeds (about 10-15)
- Planting pot or a sunny place outside to plant your seeds
- · Dirt (enough to fill the pot)
- Water
- Sunshine

If using a planting pot, place your dirt inside planting pot. Place your seeds about 1 inch deep into the dirt. Water immediately after planting.

Water once a week and continue to weed out (remove) the weakest plants and any weeds that may grow close to your seeds. You should begin to see plants in about 10 days.

Keep in mind that to grow a watermelon takes extra special care. While you may not grow a watermelon, you should begin to grow the vine. If you do grow a watermelon, it may not taste as good as those you buy at the grocery store because watermelon growers have years of experience growing great tasting watermelons.


